## MISSIONAL HABITS #5: BEING "SENT OUT"

Luke 10:25-37

In the first part of Luke 10, is the account of the seventy two people Jesus 'sent out', to announce His coming. They then returned talking about what happened! In this section of the chapter, Jesus had a very interesting discussion with a 'law expert', probably a Pharisee, about who is our 'neighbor'? It is the story about a Samaritan, (an outcast, half-Jew, considered as low as an animal), fulfilling the intent of the law's command in Leviticus 19:18, "....love your neighbor as yourself." Basically, anyone we encounter who has a need which we can respond to, is the 'neighbor' to whom we are 'sent'.

Jesus is already at work in the world, and invites us to join him in it! What a privilege! And when we fail, God's work is limited!
